Subject: Self-Audits of Programs and Facilities Subject to Certification Audits	Regulations: 6VAC35-20-61

This Guidance Document is intended to provide the field with additional guidance and information on the self-audit process.

- 1. Juvenile facilities not scheduled for certification audit in 2014 shall conduct an audit prior to December 31, 2014.
- 2. The self-audit checklists are on the Department of Juvenile Justice's website.
- 3. Programs and facilities are **not** required to use the self-audit checklist but are strongly encouraged to use the checklist.
- 4. Program and facility administrators determine the size of the self-audit team and the duration of the self-audit.
- 5. Self-audits may be conducted over a period of days, weeks, or months.
- 6. The Certification Team randomly selects approximately 10% of the files or reviewable documents up to 15 and no fewer than five when conducting audits.
- 7. Program and facility administrators determine the number of files and which files will be audited.
- 8. A critical regulatory requirement may or may not be a health, welfare, safety violation.
 - a. Critical regulatory requirements are those regulatory requirements for programs or facilities, as defined by the Board that must be maintained at 100% compliance. Critical regulatory requirements were previously termed "mandatory standards
 - b. Health, welfare, or safety violations are any action or omission that causes an immediate and substantial threat to the health, welfare, or safety of the juveniles or staff in juvenile residential facilities.
 - c. Example: All three residential regulations (6VAC35-41-430, 6VAC35-71-380, and 6VAC35-101-450) identify disposal of garbage and waste as a critical regulatory requirement. The regulations requires provisions be made for the collection and legal disposal of all garbage and waste materials.
 - i. A facility allowing trash service to lapse for a two week period with no provision to transport trash to the local dump is a critical violation but two weeks without trash service does not rise to the level of a health, welfare or safety violation.
 - ii. A facility allowing trash service to lapse for three months causing a rodent

infestation is critical violation and a health, welfare and safety violation.

- 9. Non-compliance identified in a self-audit may or may not be grounds for the Certification Team to find a facility in non-compliance.
 - a. If the sample used by the Certification Team does not capture the same sample as the self-audit there would be no certification finding of non-compliance.
 - b. Non-compliance identified in a self-audit with documentation of the implementation of a corrective action plan will be noted in the certification audit as appropriate.
 - c. Per 6VAC35-20-100 (E) (1) the director may consider any aggravating and mitigating circumstances affecting the facts resulting in any finding of noncompliance.
